In the light of uncertain trading conditions this sale in particular was always going to be seen as a market tester - a barometer of how the collecting scene generally was holding up.

The show itself was, as ever, an event which bucked the trends of, in the main, disappointing Show attendances. Elsecar **continues** to draw in both the crowds (with a definite objective to **buy**), and a never ending array of stallholders (always changing) importantly with much fresh to market stock. In general it was a very good auction, with some fine achievements. A few bargains throughout, but that's the lure, of sales. Pot lids & black glass were perhaps the best 2 areas? The sale showed the overall market has not collapsed completely, as some are saying, and when collectors are persuaded to attend, with a clear intent to buy (as opposed to just view/ "keep an eye in" as is evident at so many shows) then we all go home & sleep more easily!

**Coloured Lids:** Our Pets (KM330) £285. Dragoon Charge jar (KM510) £220 (almost double top est). Parish Beadle (KM322) £160 (double top est). Some healthy prices.

**Monochrome Lids:** The large blue Gosnell bear was chased eagerly - £1,485 proving a winner against £300-400 est. Atkinson Oriental (pink background + \*) £480. Alexandra - withdrawn (found to be repaired). Bell & Croydon shop front £275.

**Ginger Beers:** The superb Thomas Hodgson (Galtee More) £800. The unique Chas B. Inman £825. A. N. Dodds £230 - a good buy?

**Inks:** Mint (impressed to rear) Daniel Lambert £1,370 - and there's still a queue of us waiting for one! Mr Punch £230 - a very good buy? Pale green teakettle £195.

**Cures/Poisons/Pharmacy:** Pint green Warners Diabetes £320. Fishers Seaweed Extract £390. Pale blue Handysides Blood Food £195. Riga Balsam (superb mint example) £460 (found in a drawer by a London furniture dealer). Boval inhaler (complete) £400.

**Minerals:** Aylesbury 10oz green codd £230. Wadsworth green Dobson patent £185. Amber dumpy codd £140. Early Grantham hamilton £175. Nottingham hybrid £150. Best seltzer performer was the aqua Maughans pictorial at £95.

**Stoneware:** Fiddimans Newark slab seal (base flake) £255. L.Gunson (flat) slab seal £255. Tunbridge 1762 dated tankard (damages, repaired) £550. Saltglaze toby £320. General saltglaze jugs, & other shapes, were very mixed - many bargains.

**Misc:** Unique 'Silall' ointment £630 (excellent range coming up January 8th). Leeds crested eyebath £665. Blue & white eyebath £140. Pale blue unstemmed eyebath £95.

**Night Lights:** 2 floral decorated shades + Clarke bases £265. Flower shaped shade £105.

**Black Glass:** An excellent spread - sealed mallet 'T.W.' (dull) £710. Early English onion £435. Miniature sealed cylinder 'J.U.S.C.' £365. Sealed cylinder 'All Souls...' - classic, crude, quality £275. 'H.C. 1815' dated cylinder £210. Fabulous light coloured pictorial griffin seal £195. Boot Shape £255. Crude flared lip pharmacy jar £230. Full body sheen mallet £255. Best & earliest of the octagonal utilities range £255. Some large chemists type globes performed well at £170-205 etc.
